- a) Principal Report: Geannette Lehman
 - 1) Moved into modular classrooms! Waiting for other items but classes are in.
 - 2) Teachers and EAs will be at PCCE Teachers Convention on Oct 19/20. Theme is Deeper: Having An Agenda. Keynote is Dr. Christina Edmonson. She will lead us through three sessions: Having an agenda of Love, Having an agenda of courage, Having an agenda of care.
 - 3) Parent teacher conferences were on Oct. 5. We had many parents and students come.
 - 4) Book fair was in the first week of October. Raised \$2,000 for the library.

- 5) High school retreat for all Gurber students on October 30th. They will be going to Camp Evergreen in Sundre. First retreat since before Covid.
- b) Update from School Board: Cathy Peacocke
 - 1) Already had a meeting with the school admin.
 - 2) Former school council chair and instructor for ASCA.
 - 3) Board met with the City Council. Last year, the school board met with students grade six and up about what made a good day.

 - 5) Student enrollment was 11,424 and increased 244. 1423 staff, 608 teachers
