

Graduation Attire.


There will be a Grand March around the gym to start the banquet evening. Grads meet in the den at 6:25 p.m. for this special entrance.

If you have more than one child, check on each child's name at the top and repeat these steps to view their report card.


Our Field Day on Wednesday was so much FUN!
